A Message from Norma Milton



2017 was another busy year.

This was a year of miracles that has allowed HHPR to continue much needed programs and to expand for the most needy families and pets.

Income:

• Grants: \$43,500

• Public donations: \$24,125

• Insurance beneficiary: \$7000

• Fundraising: \$30,100

Expenses: \$77,748 including;

- Vet care / Medical supplies: \$32,194
- Special needs cats: \$10,246
- Operating expenses: Rent \$10,956 and \$24,000 for all operating expenses at the four locations; Adoption Center, Intake Center, Warehouse, and Second Chance Thrift Store.

Grant breakdown:

\$8,700 from Maine Community Foundation that was used for the 40 Broadway warehouse renovations.

- \$1,000 from Bangor Savings Bank for spay expenses.
- **\$33,800** donated by the **Elmina Sewall Foundation** Grant which we used in March 2018 to purchase a new transport van.

Pet Population: Jan 2017 began with 64 in-house cats & kittens. Another 221 cats came in. We had **203 live discharges**, 11 cats required euthanasia for severe injuries, extreme neglect, or a terminal diagnosis with main causes being cancer and vehicle accidents.

Only when our vet tells us there is no hope of recovery and only suffering ahead do we make a heartbreaking decision to relieve the suffering. Eleven heartbreaks or about 5% of our total population but too many heartbreaks for HHPR volunteer hearts. Dec 2017 we had 71 cats / kittens for inhouse care.

Programs: We expanded pet feeding programs to **Meals on** Wheels, feral colonies, and other professionally referred lowincome families with pets as well as continued service to elderly and disabled families. We fed about 200 animals daily (cats and dogs) throughout the winter of 2017-2018.

HHPR is a huge volunteer team and the team mission is WE CARE.

All of these remarkable projects are made possible by our very generous grantors and our 56 dedicated volunteers. We also greatly appreciate our public donors and all the people who come to support our fundraising activities. I am so grateful to the following people:

Help for Graylee - Your \$1 Donation Can Make a Big Difference

Halfway Home Pet Rescue recently admitted little Graylee to receive rehabilitation at a foster home. She was struck by a car near Littleton and remained on the side of the road for hours on a cold rainy day as hundreds of cars drove by her. Finally a young couple stopped to rescue her and take her for medical care.

Graylee is very thin, dehydrated and has several broken bones. She has since come into HHPR for continued care until her medical situation is more stable and then she will be permanently adopted by her Rescue Angels. Each day we see her improve just a little.

Graylee's worst time of day is when she has to be bathed because she is not able to keep herself clean at this time. Her best time appears to be a draw between having a choice of several choices of food to enjoy and the warmth of being wrapped securely in a blanket and rocked for 20 minutes until she falls asleep after the trauma and pain of her daily bath.

Graylee is believed to be about 10 years old. She is very loving and likes to talk or grumble when having to take her medication or get ready for her bath. She has become very alert and appears to be quite intelligent. She will continue at her HHPR foster home for about 6 weeks with the need to go weekly to our vet for observation and to change the cast. Her left front leg is broken in two places and her right front paw has four broken bones and is now also in a cast. She also has a great many bruises.

Graylee's medical care will be expensive and we are re-creating our \$1.00 donation challenge directly in honor of helping Graylee's recovery. If you can afford a dollar, please share it with Graylee with a short note of comforting love. Graylee wants to recover and you can see this in her face each time she is touched. Van Donation Enables HHPR to Continue Outreach Programs

Another miracle has happened for the Halfway Home Pet Rescue programs of food supply transport, feline transport, thrift store transport and the feral colony Trap, Neuter Release (T/N/R) program.

The HHPR Board of Directors were finding it extremely difficult to carry on all the current activities of the rescue without having a safe, reliable transport system, however, the pet rescue received a grant from the **Elmina B. Sewall Foundation** of \$33,800 in late 2017 for the purchase of a transport van.

The rescue has now purchased a new 2017 Dodge Ram Promaster cargo van which will enable the organization to continue all the community out-reach programs.

"The **Sewall Foundation** supports work in Maine to improve the well-being of people, animals and environment," according to its website. HHPR is very grateful for their huge donation to keep our community programs growing.
