Doug Morrill, and repair of the building donated by **Dean Staples Construction**, window protections frames from Jeff Baker Sheet Metal. steps and internal repairs donated by Joel Violette of Woodland.

We also received a \$1,000 grant from the Bangor Savings Bank for spay/neuter expenses and an \$8,700 grant from the Maine Community Grant Foundation to help pay for the repairs of the building.

The Elmina B. Sewall Foundation provided funding for the purchase of a new vehicle and expenses totaling \$33,800. A need for a vehicle had been a deep worry to us since our 20 year old donated vehicle had to be passed on to the junk yard - putting our pet transport system, our feral

This year has been a program and the food pantry system at grave risk of having to be discontinued. From Jan. to Nov. 2017, HHPR has provided daily food for an additional 150 animals (dogs, cats, rabbits, birds, etc.) through our food pantry with Meals on Wheels, foster homes, low-income, disabled and elderly families. This is in addition to the 278 "at risk" cats that have needed on-site care.

> All of these precious gifts and the determination of our dedication volunteers, who worked twice as hard during the 3 months while I recovered from a fall — kept **Halfway Home Pet** Rescue actively rescuing cats. They never slowed down.

> I cannot praise each individual who contributed to keeping the rescue at full operating speed. But please know I am grateful to all of you for helping our precious cats and kittens. May you be greatly blessed for caring and providing for these animals.
