#### **Notes from Norma**



This statement of Saint Francis of Assisi is a classic lesson of how and why Halfway Home Pet rescue was created. A large colony of feral cats lived at the Madawaska lake where my husband and I had retired. I heard many people say "Someone should do something about these feral cats."

But it never happened and the discussions continued during coffee visits at Stan's Madawaska Lake Store. Although I had operated a pet boarding kennel for many years and had rescued a number of cats and dogs for about 45 years, I enjoyed being retired and loved the peace and quiet of lake life. I listened to the talk, but said nothing.

On a beautiful winter day in mid-December as I stood at the kitchen window washing dishes I noticed a mid-size, white and black cat walking gingerly across the thin ice. "Oh, no," I whispered, "no, no, no, little one." When the cat was about 20 feet from shore the ice fractured and she went down. I screamed in horror and frustration for there was no way to save that poor cat. My husband came running and when I finished sobbing the story about the cat, Everett added "Well, **SOMEONE** really needs to do something about those cats."

I felt the heat of being called and there would be no turning back. **It was necessary** for me to alert the neighbors of a simple rescue plan. We fundraised, rescued, sterilized and rehomed the entire colony to a local farmer's barn. Newspaper and television coverage introduced new people to the endeavor and more supplies were donated.

We learned **it is possible** to create a volunteer rescue with many people doing different tasks and the general public donating supplies and funding. A non-profit corporation was created. Grants were written and accepted. Halfway Home Pet Rescue became an entity based on the foundation of **volunteerism doing the impossible.** All these people each doing what they were able to do saved and sterilized thousands of cats, but also aided dogs in need of medical care or food supplies.

Halfway Home Pet Rescue is a state of Maine licensed pet rescue and a 501c3 volunteer-based workforce for animals accepting cats at greatest risk, providing a **Free Pet Food Pantry, and a Free Feline Spay/Neuter Clinic.** HHPR is now widely known as a Feline Rescue and Rehabilitation Center and as Aroostook County's INN for precious cats.

A great deal of our success was derived through generous grants from the Maine Community Foundation Aroostook County Fund, The Elmina B. Sewall Foundation, and the May HTR Foundation. Dedicated volunteers handle our direct cat care, fundraising and office work. Several veterinarians have assisted with discounted services for medical needs: Drs. Nick and Andrea Pesut, Dr. Lori Brown and Dr. Beth Sperry. All of these individual blessings created the miracle of a volunteer pet rescue for Aroostook County.

Halfway Home Pet Rescue is partnering with **Dr. Elisabeth Sperry and her team** of vet techs from Portland. The team just completed their second Free Spay Clinic at the Caribou Wellness Center.
